Predominant reason for girls dropping out is family constraints (32.5% at secondary level)

Cost of education emerges as the reason for nearly 21% girls dropping out from school without completing their education



Udyam Aadhaar is identity card of Ministry of Micro Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME). This helps entrepreneur to apply for government schemes, and other licensing related to business like shop act, trademark for business names etc.

The average household income has gone up from USD 120 to USD 180 per month The average individual monthly income of beneficiaries has gone up from USD 1 to USD 13 per month
